

Our Lenten season begins Wednesday, March 6 @ 6:00 pm with a delicious potluck preceding our Ash Wednesday communion service at 7:00 pm. We will continue our theme, Behold the Man! each Sunday as we draw closer to God during this holy season."

"Behold the man!" proclaimed the unwitting preacher Pontius Pilate in one of the shortest, yet most profound, sermons ever recorded. This will be our endeavor this Lententide and Easter Sunday. Behold the man, God in human flesh, Jesus. His incarnation will provide the basis for our meditation and proclamation on His Passion. And His real, bodily suffering and death will provide the basis for our full-throated proclamation on Easter morning of a bodily resurrection, not just of Jesus but also for His saints. Real bodies that have suffered, wept, bled, prayed, eaten, hoped, and more will be those raised incorruptible from their graves on the day of Jesus' return.

We will fix our eyes and our preaching on the man Jesus, contemplating the inescapable fact—indeed the most important fact in the course of human history—that God became man. The Second Person of the eternal, triune God, who we confess in the Nicene Creed as "God of God, Light of light, very God of very God . . . of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made," became a living, breathing, flesh-and-blood human being, a man.

Each week, we'll consider a different aspect of the body of Jesus Christ. What does it mean that, in Jesus, God has hands, feet, lungs, lips, eyes, and ears?

Behold the man! In sermon, in study, in devotion, behold the man! God's richest blessings my friends,



Hello my name is Clyde Drake and I first attended Salem Lutheran church as a high school senior 51 years ago. It was at the invitation of a pretty young redhead named Sue Everts who asked me to attend the Christmas Eve candlelight service with her. How could I refuse? Sue who had attended Salem her whole life was already a Sunday school teacher. I managed to attend several other services throughout the year with Sue and after I returned home from one service I told my mother that I felt like Pastor Knueppel had been preaching directly to me. My mother who was the family historian for her generation promptly told me she wasn't surprised as my great great maternal grandfather Carl Joern had helped start Salem Lutheran Church being the congregation's first president. In 1972 I would be married at Salem Lutheran Church to Sue Everts my gorgeous

redheaded bride and joined the church the next year.

Together we raised four children Brian, Daniel, Roxanne, and Julie. Each of our children were baptized, attended Sunday school and were confirmed at Salem. Both of our daughters were married at Salem.

Salem had become an important part of our lives and I looked for opportunities to serve. Since my father-in-law was head usher I was asked by him to become an usher and I performed this service for several years. Over the years I have been a Sunday School Teacher and then I served many years as the Sunday school treasurer. I was then elected to many terms as the Church Treasurer and held this position as we built the education building in 1991. I have been the congregational president and was personally proud to be the Congregational President as Salem celebrated its 125th anniversary in 1996. Although nothing was mentioned to my knowledge I was the only descendant present from the eight men who started our church back in 1871.

Opportunities for Christians to serve are not limited to church alone and in 1995 I was elected to the Griffith Institute school board for ten years and served as President for seven of those years. In 2014 I was elected to a four year term on the town board of the Town of Concord as a councilman. In 2018 I was elected to a four year term, and presently serve as Supervisor of the Town of Concord. Many people have asked why you put yourself through the aggravation and I always reply because you always hope to make a difference. A deeper theological question would be what would God have you do with your life or for what purpose were we created. The answer is not always evident but ours to discover.

Today our life continues to be blessed. We currently have nine grandchildren to love and watch as their lives take shape. Salem is growing under the leadership of Pastor Goodwin. Many opportunities for members to serve are available. I hope you will try to find Gods purpose for you. I have been married now for 46 years to the love of my life, my gorgeous red headed bride and we still attend and participate in weekly services at Salem. I am thankful Christ is a part of my life and that I said yes so many years ago.
